## Righteousness Needed For The World

<sup>5</sup> *Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins.* <sup>6</sup> *The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them.* <sup>7</sup> *The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.* (Isaiah 11:5-7).

November marks a historic election for the United States. Members of Congress and the Presidency are in sometimes contentious elections that has sown discord and division across the country. Around the world, there are people who are doing evil things against

other people and there are people who are being dealt hard blows by people.

Do not host or participate in any in-person festivities if you or anyone in your household

If you are at [increased risk of severe illness](#) from COVID-19, or live or work with someone at increased risk of severe illness, you should

- Avoid in-person gatherings with people who do not live in your household.
- Avoid larger gatherings and consider attending activities that pose lower risk (as described throughout this page) if you decide to attend an in-person gathering with people who do not live in your household.

This fall, the Energy, Climate and Social Change seminar course challenged students to educate the Notre Dame community on issues of sustainability.

*We are pledging to make changes to our own actions and gauge support for community action.*

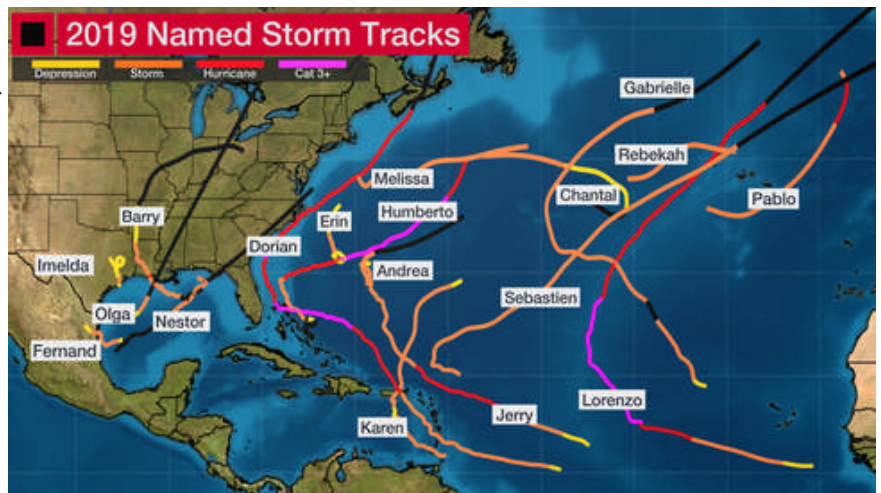
At the end of the semester, student Nathaniel Hiott and other members of the Energy Group presented their final data — the total number of signatures they receive and the preferred actions students want to see the University take — to the Office of Sustainability. Members from this office will then use this information to guide the administration in their rewriting of the University’s long-term sustainability goals, which occurs every four to five years.

## U.S. Officially Leaving Paris Climate Agreement on Wednesday, November 4, 2020

The United States will formally leave the Paris Agreement on Wednesday, no matter who wins the election. Of the nearly 200 nations that signed the agreement, the U.S. is the only one to walk away from its promises to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

"The lack of action at the federal level is a serious problem," says Rachel Cleetus, policy director for the climate and energy program at the Union of Concerned Scientists, a science advocacy group. The costs of climate-driven disasters such as hurricanes, heat waves and wildfires are rising, she says. In 2020, there have already been 16 climate-driven disasters that cost at least \$1 billion each, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

"Climate change is clearly not just an environmental issue," Cleetus says. "It is threatening our economy. It's threatening our future prosperity, the well-being of future generations."

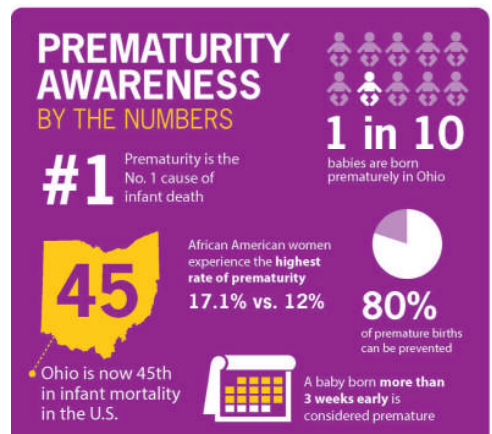
